David brings twenty-five years of non-profit experience, initially in a variety of town management roles in Pennsylvania, with the last eighteen years in Jewish communal service at the local, regional, and national level. This includes serving as the lead executive of the Jewish Federation and Jewish Community Center of Greater Harrisburg, Friends of the Arava Institute, the Isabella Freedman Jewish Retreat Center, and Hazon. Among David's proudest achievements is pioneering the first Jewish LGBTQ Teen programming in the country, in partnership with the non-profit Keshet organization. David's unique skills and expertise in leading organizations through mergers, turnarounds, and transitions, while developing innovative solutions to build community, reach the under-served, and engage the disengaged, are perfectly tailored to address the opportunities in our community.

Search committee co-chair Amy Rich states, "David is a natural story-teller whose warmth was immediately felt by all who met him. His depth of Jewish knowledge coupled with his immense creativity will help FJP reach all corners of the Jewish community as well as find common ground where we can all come together." Her co-chair, Julia Marx adds, "His broad experience includes helping other organizations and communities successfully join together into a greater whole. David has a strong track record of running organizations that successfully achieve their mission while remaining fiscally sound."

David will officially join us on August 10. He is eagerly looking forward to getting to know our community, and we will provide ample opportunities in the coming weeks and months for you to get to know him as well.

We owe a debt of gratitude to our tireless search committee, including Julia Marx, Amy Rich, Jon August, Wendy Cohen, Karen Ferleger, Mark Kirsch, David Muller, Linda Russ, Jeff Siegel, Ed Smolka and Gayle Weinstein.
